

ORDINANCE 2010-22

AN ORDINANCE INCREASING THE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF PARKING REGULATIONS OF THE VILLAGE OF HIRAM, OHIO.

WHEREAS, Chapter 76 of the Ohio Basic Code previously adopted by the Village of Hiram, sets forth regulations for parking generally and for waiver fees for violations of parking provisions; and

WHEREAS, it has been over ten years since the last increase which was in February, 2000.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the Village of Hiram, Portage County, State of Ohio, a majority of the members elected thereto concurring:

Section One: Effective March 1, 2011, the waiver fees (penalties) for violations of the Village parking regulations shall be increased as follows:

A). For parking violations other than in a fire lane, within ten feet of a fire hydrant, or in a handicapped or disability parking space, penalty shall be:

- 1). Fifteen dollars (\$15) if paid within twenty-four hours after issuance of the citation.
- 2). Thirty dollars (\$30) if not paid within twenty-four hours after issuance of the citation.

B). For parking violations in a fire lane or within ten feet of a fire hydrant, if paid within twenty-four after issuance of the citation the penalty shall be thirty dollars (\$30), if not paid within twenty-four hours after issuance of the citation the penalty shall be sixty dollars (\$60).


C). For parking violation in a handicapped or disability parking space, penalty shall be two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) and automatic tow at the expense of the violator.

Section Two: Ordinance 99-31 and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.






