

ORDINANCE 2007-25

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE BID OF PERRIN ASPHALT COMPANY, INC. FOR HINSDALE RESURFACING PROJECT, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND FISCAL OFFICER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH PERRIN ASPHALT COMPANY, INC., AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, sealed bids were received by the Village of Hiram on August 31, 2007 for resurfacing Hinsdale Street in accordance with the specifications on file with the Village; and

WHEREAS, the following bids were received: Perrin Asphalt Company, Inc. \$43,350, Ronyak Paving, Inc. \$47,020, and Chagrin Valley Paving, Inc. \$48,930; and

WHEREAS, the bid from Perrin Asphalt Company, Inc., 525 Dan Street, Akron, Ohio 44310 was determined by the Village of Hiram to be the lowest and best bid received therefore; and

WHEREAS, in conformance with law said bids have been discussed with and considered by the Council of the Village of Hiram.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Hiram, Portage County, Ohio, with at least two-thirds of the members thereto concurring that:

SECTION 1: The actions of the Village Administrator in bidding the Hinsdale resurfacing project are hereby ratified.

SECTION 2: Perrin Asphalt Company, Inc.'s bid for resurfacing Hinsdale Street is hereby determined to be the lowest and best and most responsive bid received.

SECTION 3: The Mayor and Fiscal Officer are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Perrin Asphalt Company, Inc., 525 Dan Street, Akron, Ohio 44310 in the amount of \$43,450; said agreement to be substantially in conformance with the terms and conditions as hereto attached as Exhibit "A."


SECTION 4: This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, effective immediately on its passage, to enable the Village to continue the usual daily services necessary for the preservation of the public health, peace, safety and welfare, and to have Hinsdale Street resurfaced by the 2007-2008 winter season.

SECTION 5: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this council concerning and relating to the adoption of the Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including §121.22 of the Revised Code of the State of Ohio.

**Village of Hiram
Streets Improvements, 2007
General Specifications**

1. Materials to be used shall conform to the standards and specifications established by the State of Ohio Department of Transportation for materials used, amount of liquids used per ton or square feet, and also aggregate in regards to asphalt paving or slurry sealing.
2. Contractor shall furnish all barricades, warning lights, and flaggers for traffic control or for safe passage of pedestrians and vehicular traffic until project is completed.
3. The contractor or contractors who are awarded the contracts for asphalt paving will at the time of notification of such award convey in writing the started date of each phase of project. Asphalt pavings are to be completed 20 days from start date. All projects are to be completed by November 30, 2007.

Foul weather May extend completion dates only as long as it takes for construction site conditions to return to normal.

Hinsdale St. Resurfacing

Hinsdale St. Resurfacing project will require two phases.

Phase I

Beginning at intersection of Garfield rd. 43' A, but joint shall be ground to a depth of 2 inches to O towards Hinsdale, at a 6 foot width. Street grinding at concrete curbs, and/or gutters, shall be ground at a depth of 2 inches to O towards the roads crown, at a width of 6 feet. Curb grinding shall continue to the end of intersection radius at Plum Ridge, Peckham, Wrenwood, and Dean followed with a 2 inch to zero towards the crown of Hinsdale St. Butt joint shall be 6 feet wide across each intersection. Painted lines will be supplied for reference. The total lineal feet of grinding will be 2,920 feet. All irregularities of ³/₄ of an inch in road surface shall be ground or patched before paving. The road surface will then be swept clean.

Phase II

Asphalt tack will be applied on a dry road surface immediately prior to a 1/2 inch compacted 404 limestone asphalt leveling coat. Followed by a 1.5 inch compacted 404 limestone overlay. 1.5 inches is to be maintained over entire road surface.

All grades to storm sewer drains shall be retained. All storm sewer, water boxes, and sanitary sewer manholes will meet finished road surface. All risers shall be supplied by contractor. Asphalt must be applied in two passes, excluding road approaches. Total square feet 47,545.

Entire perimeter of new asphalt will be sealed. Asphalt to asphalt joints will be sealed with AGIO or AC20, or approved sealant. Asphalt to concrete will be sealed with MC 800 or MC 3000, or approved sealant.

As trucks arrive, copies of computer-generated weight tickets will be given to Village employee.

Sealed proposals are due at Hiram Village Hall on August 31 2007 at 11:00 am.
