

ORDINANCE 2008-17

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PERMANENT APPROPRIATIONS IN THE GENERAL FUND (1000) THE POLICE DEPARTMENT (1000-110) AND THE FIRE DEPARTMENT (1000-120) OTHER OPERATIONS SECTION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Village has entered into an agreement with Hiram College for certain services to be rendered by the Police Department and the Fire Department and the amount of the fee set forth in the agreement is \$61,000, which amount represents an increase over that previously appropriated in the amount of \$5,920.00; and

WHEREAS, Fifty Five (55) percent of the increase should be allocated to the Police Department and Forty Five (45) percent of the increase should be allocated to the Fire Department; and

WHEREAS, both departments are requesting their appropriations be increased.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Hiram, Portage County, Ohio, with at least two-thirds of the members thereto concurring that:

SECTION 1: Fifty-five percent of the increase of \$5,920 is \$3,256. The appropriation for *other operations* of the Police Department is hereby increased by \$3,256 for a total *other operations* appropriation of \$101,987. The total appropriations for the Police Department will be increased to \$255,681.


SECTION 2: Forty-five percent of the increase of \$5,920 is \$2,664. The appropriation for *other operations* of the Fire Department is hereby increased by \$2,664 for a total *other operations* appropriation of \$92,674. The total appropriations for the Fire Department will be increased to \$129,674.

SECTION 3: The current appropriations in the General Fund are \$878,123. The new appropriations will be \$884,043.


SECTION 4: That this Ordinance be declared an emergency measure becoming effective immediately upon its passage by Council and approval by the Mayor because this would allow the village's appropriations to be accurately portrayed to the citizens of the village of Hiram and so that the Hiram Police and Fire Departments can immediately make use of the additional money appropriated to the respective departments in this Ordinance.

SECTION 5: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this council concerning and relating to the adoption of the Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including §121.22 of the Revised Code of the State of Ohio.

This piece of legislation passed as an emergency on August 12, 2008.



Exhibit "A"

AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Village of Hiram Police and Fire Departments have provided certain services to Hiram College since their inceptions; and, in the spirit of cooperation, the College voluntarily has provided a financial contribution to help support such services; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Hiram Police and Fire Departments, as a matter of law, provide 24-hour a day response to emergencies and requests for assistance for the Hiram College campus; and

NOW, with intent to be bound, officials of the College and the Village enter into the following agreement:

TERM:

This contract will begin January 1, 2008 for a term of ~~three (3) years~~, renewable upon agreement of the parties.

SCOPE OF SERVICES:

POLICE: In addition to services required by law, the Village of Hiram Police Department will provide the following services pursuant to the agreement:

- P1: Regular car patrol of the Hiram campus on a daily basis throughout the course of each 24-hour day.
- P2: Advise the College, through appropriate personnel, of current law enforcement concerns that may impact the College.
- P3: The Department will provide 24-hour a day dispatch service for the on-campus emergency phones.
- P4: As time permits, provide foot patrols on campus grounds during evenings in the areas of Hinsdale Courtyard, Martin Common, and the athletic fields.
- P5: Maintain a regular line of communication with the College by weekly meeting with the appropriate staff.
- P6: Assist with Hiram College Bookstore security.
- P7: Provide an officer to assist with traffic and planning for Freshman Arrival Day and be present during Freshman Arrival Day and Opening Convocation procession.
- P8: Provide money escorts for deposit, e.g., Theatre Box Office, Business Office.

- P9: Assist with removal of illegally parked or abandoned vehicles on the Hiram Campus.
- P10: Assist, as available, Hiram College security with escort for Hiram College students and staff.
- P11: Provide officer(s) for all men's and women's intercollegiate home football (2), volleyball (1), basketball (2), soccer (1), baseball (1), and rugby (1) games if held on campus. The Hiram College Athletic Department will assign a contact person who will be responsible for notifying the Police Department of all schedule changes.
- P12: Provide officer(s) for Commencement, Homecoming and other special events as requested by the College on a fee-for-service basis.
- P13: Provide officer(s) for College dances and social events upon request on a fee-for-service basis.
- P14: Such other assistance, duties or responsibilities as shall be agreed to by the parties.
- P15: By request and prior approval, up to ten free passes will be issued to the Police Department for use of the athletic facilities under the same conditions as facilities are made available to College employees.
- P16: Provide weekly reports of police activity involving the college (students and others). This should be the same information that is ultimately required for inclusion in the annual Student Right to Know (Cleary) Report.
- P17: In the event that Hiram College receives the Department of Education Emergency Management in Higher Education grant, the Village of Hiram Police Department will comply with the grant Partnership Agreement already endorsed and submitted with the grant proposal.

FIRE: In addition to services required by law, the Village of Hiram Fire Department will provide the following services pursuant to the agreement:

- F1: Advise the College, through appropriate personnel, of current fire and life-safety issues that may impact the College.
- F2: The Department will provide 24-hour a day dispatch service for the on-campus emergency phones.
- F3: Maintain regular lines of communication with the College by meeting with the appropriate staff.

- F4: Assist, upon request, with the training of Hiram College faculty, staff and students regarding fire department-related life-safety issues.
- F5: Continue the program of Hiram College facility inspection for purposes of code compliance. The Department will notify appropriate College officials a minimum of 5 days before any routine inspection and system test.
- F6: Provide an ambulance and certified attendants for all intercollegiate home football games.
- F7: Provide an ambulance and certified attendants for Commencement, the Hiram Hustle road race and the Run for Grace and Andy.
- F8: Such other assistance, duties or responsibilities as shall be agreed to by the parties.
- F9: By request and prior approval, up to ten free passes will be issued to the Fire Department for use of the athletic facilities under the same conditions as facilities are made available to College employees.
- F10: In the event that Hiram College receives the Department of Education Emergency Management in Higher Education grant, the Village of Hiram Fire Department will comply with the grant Partnership Agreement already endorsed and submitted with the grant proposal.

FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION:

For the ~~year ended December 31, 2008~~, the College shall contribute a total of ~~\$61,000~~ to the Village. For the year ended December 31, 2009, the College shall contribute a total of \$64,050. For the year ended ~~(December 31, 2010)~~ the College shall contribute a total of ~~\$66,600~~. These contributions will be paid in four equal quarterly installments during the first year of the contract.

CHANGES OR AMENDMENTS:

The within agreement may be amended in writing by mutual consent.


CANCELLATION:

Either party may cancel this agreement upon providing ninety (90) days written notice of such intention to the other party.


COUNTERPART EXECUTION:
