

ORDINANCE 2011-22

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PERMANENT APPROPRIATIONS IN THE STATE EMS GRANT FUND (2062) BY \$2,100 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Assistant Fire Chief informed the Fiscal Officer of an award of \$4,000 for an EMS grant; and

WHEREAS, the EMS grant is a reimbursing grant so money will have to be advanced to the EMS Grant Fund (2062); and

WHEREAS, the advance made to the State EMS grant fund from the General Fund will need to be repaid when the reimbursement arrives.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Hiram, Portage County, Ohio, two thirds or more of the members thereto concurring that:

Section 1: The current appropriations in the State EMS Fund (2062) are \$5,900. The appropriations need increased by \$2,100. The new appropriations will be \$8,000. This will allow for the advance to be repaid.


Section 2: This Ordinance is declared an emergency measure becoming effective immediately upon its passage by Council and approval by the Mayor to allow the fire department to begin using the grant funds to provide for the health and safety of the residents of the Village of Hiram.

Section 3: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the council and any committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including §121.22 of the Revised Code of the State of Ohio.


This piece of legislation was passed as an emergency on August 9, 2011.


