

ORDINANCE 2011-25

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PERMANENT APPROPRIATIONS IN THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND (4901) BY \$13,584 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Street Department is in need of a new pickup truck; and

WHEREAS, the Street Department has \$13,584 in the Capital Fund for capital expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the Village Administrator has researched the cost of a 2012 Chevrolet Silverado 3500HD 4WD as well as the cost of a Blizzard snow plow using the state bid pricing.


NOW THEREFOR BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Hiram, Portage County, Ohio, two-thirds or more of the members thereto concurring that:

Section 1: The current appropriations in the Capital Improvement Fund are \$25,000. They need to be increased by \$13,584 to \$38,584.

Section 2: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, effective immediately upon its passage, the particular emergency being the need to order the 2012 pickup truck and wait for delivery in time for the winter weather.

Section 3: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the council and any committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including §121.22 of the Revised Code of the State of Ohio.


This piece of legislation was passed as an emergency on September 13, 2011.




