

ORDINANCE 2016-03

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PERMANENT APPROPRIATIONS IN THE GENERAL FUND (1000) POLICE DEPARTMENT (110) AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, revenue has been received into the General Fund from the sale or disposal of equipment owned by the Village of Hiram that has been determined no longer needed for any municipal purpose; and

WHEREAS, revenue has been received into the General Fund from the Villages' liability insurance carrier for the loss of our 2013 Police Cruiser during a mutual aid call; and

WHEREAS, the Police Chief presented to the Finance Committee his desire to utilize these funds to help purchase a new 2016 Ford Explorer to replace the 2013 Police Cruiser with the balance of the purchase price to be paid out of the Police Department current appropriations budget.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Hiram, Portage County, Ohio, two-thirds (2/3) or more of the members thereto concurring that:

Section 1: Current appropriations in the General Fund (1000) Police (110) are \$316,561.00. The increase in appropriations of \$21,237.76 from insurance monies received and \$472.00 realized from disposal of other equipment for a total of \$21,709.76 will bring the Police appropriations to \$338,270.76. The current appropriations in line item 1000-110-550-0000 for Police Motor Vehicles are Zero. The new appropriations will bring this line item to \$21,709.76. The current appropriations in the General Fund (1000) are \$1,130,585.00. The new appropriations will be \$1,152,294.76.


Section 2: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and any of its committee that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including §121.22 of the Revised Code of the State of Ohio.

Section 3: Ordinance is declared an emergency measure becoming effective immediately upon its passage by Council to advance the safety, general health and welfare of the Village and to allow for the Police Chief to maintain his fleet and enable his department to continue to perform their duties to ensure the safety and welfare of the citizens of Hiram Village and Hiram Township.




