

ORDINANCE 2016-09

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PERMANENT APPROPRIATIONS IN THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS FUND (4901) FOR STREETS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Village Administrator has advised the Finance Committee that the Street Department is in need of a new zero-turn mower to replace the 2003 Scag zero-turn mower which has a lot of hours and is in need of repair; and

WHEREAS, the funds needed for the purchase of a zero-turn mower in the amount of \$11,668.00 are not available within the Street Department 2016 appropriations; and

WHEREAS, the Village Administrator has requested to use funds in the Street Capital Improvement Fund, which now necessitates an increase in the appropriations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Hiram, Portage County, Ohio, with at least two-thirds of the members thereto concurring that:


SECTION 1: The permanent appropriations in the Capital Improvements Fund are \$24,000. The appropriations for the Street Department within the Capital Improvements Fund are ZERO. An additional \$11,668.00 must be appropriated for the purchase of the new zero-turn mower. The total appropriation in the Capital Improvement Fund for Street Equipment 4901-800-520-0006 in the amount of \$11,668.00 is authorized.

SECTION 2: The permanent appropriations for the Capital Improvement Fund will be increased by \$11,668.00 resulting in the appropriations changing from \$24,000.00 to \$35,668.00.


SECTION 3: This Ordinance is declared an emergency measure becoming effective immediately upon its passage by Council and approval by the Mayor in order to fund the purchase of a zero-turn mower in advance of the start of mowing season.

SECTION 4: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including §121.22 of the Revised Code of the State of Ohio.


