

ORDINANCE 2018-10

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PERMANENT APPROPRIATIONS IN SEVERAL FUNDS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Hiram Recreation & Park Board of the Village of Hiram has been successful in obtaining additional revenue funds through grants and wish to utilize these funds as soon as possible for costs associated with the improvements to the Village's parks; and

WHEREAS, at the end of 2017, the Fire Department traded in their 2003 Ford Life Line Ambulance towards the purchase of a new 2017 Ford Life Line Ambulance and equipped it with a Stryker Power Load Stretcher with options for a total price of \$185,999.00. Hiram Township contributed \$30,000 and the Village of Hiram contributed \$60,000 towards a down payment and financed the remaining balance by obtaining a seven-year loan with quarterly payments through Middlefield Bank; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Chief has indicated that there are sufficient capital improvement funds to make the quarterly payments on the loan and wishes to utilize these funds; and

WHEREAS, to meet these obligations several funds will need to have their appropriations increased.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Hiram, Portage County, Ohio with at least two-thirds of the members thereto concurring that:

SECTION 1: The following chart outlines the authorized amendments to the enumerated funds:


