

RESOLUTION 2014-43

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FISCAL OFFICER OF THE VILLAGE OF HIRAM TO CREATE A THEN AND NOW PURCHASE ORDER TO PAY VANCE OUTDOORS, INC. DBA VANCE'S LAW ENFORCEMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Officer of the Village of Hiram has received an invoice from the Police Department for the purchase of two (2) Taser Units with accessories for which there were no appropriations allocated in the Police Capital Improvement Fund (4901) and subsequently, no open purchase order exists prior to receiving this invoice; and

WHEREAS, the amount of the invoice exceeds \$3,000; and

WHEREAS, The Fiscal Officer has certified that at the time of the making of the contract or order for services or materials and remaining until the present that said funds are either in the treasury or in the process of collection to the credit of an appropriate fund, free from any previous encumbrances, all as required by and in conformity with Ohio Revised Code 5705.41 (D); and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Hiram has determined it is appropriate to pay the amounts set forth in the Resolution.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Hiram, County of Portage, two-thirds or more of the members elected thereto concurring that:

SECTION 1: The Village Fiscal Officer has the authority to create a purchase order:

- In the amount of \$3,100 to the Vance Outdoors, Inc. dba Vance's Law Enforcement for reimbursement of amounts expended for two (2) Tasers with all accessories.


SECTION 2: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meeting open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements of Section 121.11 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary to preserve the public health, safety, and general welfare of the inhabitants of the Village and for the further reason that it is essential that the Village pay all of its financial obligations in a timely fashion, and for this reason this Resolution shall go into full force and effect immediately upon passage by two-thirds (2/3's) of the members of Council.
